Course aim and objectives:

This course provides the students with the fundamentals of cultural studies and its correspondence to the English language, the different implications of cultural identity to languages and consequently, in the process of translation. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to determine the scope and limitations of the relationship between culture and language; identify the characteristics of culture and language depending on various contexts; infer different ways to overcome the barriers in English language translation; reflect on the value of respecting cultures and languages; and recognize the importance of appreciating one's culture and language.

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Recognize the links between culture and language, and the limits of translatability related to cultural differences.
- 2. Describe language and culture within different contexts.
- 3. Identify the challenges involved in translating to and from English in today's world.
- 4. Interpret culture in all its complex forms socially and politically where culture manifests itself.
- 5. Demonstrate appreciation and respect for other cultures and languages.
