Comments on the Program KPIs and Benchmarks results:

A thorough analysis of the KPIs above shows a slight increase in rates of students' evaluation of the quality of learning experience (4.2/5) and their evaluation of the quality of the course (4.35/5) than last year's rates (4.19) and (4.26) respectively. We can also note a clear increase in the completion rate (2.83:5) and the retention rate of first-year students (37.44%) in comparison to last year's rates (0.84:5) & (32.25%). For KPI No. 7, the program does not require or have professional and/or national examinations. With regard to KPI No. 7, with the effective contact with employers in the labor market, there is a notable response to the evaluation of the program

graduates' proficiency. Concerning the sixth KPI, there is a decrease in the number of students who were employed and enrolled in postgraduate programs (7.04%) in comparison to last year's percentage (39.15%). The reason is that the number of graduates in this year (681) is higher than the number of graduates last year (189). Also, there is a decrease in the publications of staff members (20%) in comparison to last year (28%). There is a need to encourage staff members and organize workshops about research activities for them. Moreover, by employing enough instructors, the ratio of teaching staff to students is increasing, and the actual value achieved meets the target benchmark (7:1). Furthermore, there is a notable decrease in the rate of published researches per faculty member (28%) compared to last two years (50%). Finally, there is a slight increase in the



citations rate in referred journals per faculty member (3.1/1) in comparison to the last two years. The intention to increase the rate of published researches per faculty member will positively increase citation rates.
